THE "BIGGEST MAN" AT THE DECATUR CONVENTION photographed by Edward A. Barnwell, Decatur, May 9, 1860. Barnwell wanted a portrait of the "biggest [tallest] man" at the Decatur Republican Convention, who, he was told, was a likely nominee. He hunted up Lincoln and was granted a sitting. On May 10, the following day, the delegates endorsed Lincoln.

Lost for many years, this unusual portrait (O–19) was presented by the photographer's daughter, Grace, to the Decatur Public Library in 1947.

For the first time the cord to Lincoln's spectacles is clearly visible in a photograph.
