Perhaps because Lincoln's friend and bodyguard, Ward Hill Lamon, was also wearing a plug hat and was nearly as tall as the President, the cameraman asked him to be seated so as not to draw attention from Lincoln, the central figure in the group. Lincoln dominates the soldiers around him precisely in the way that Governor John A. Andrew of Massachusetts remembered: "He stood, like Saul, among his veterans, head and shoulders above every man."

Ozias M. Hatch of Illinois identified the persons standing with the President, and this is believed to be the first publication with the identifications: *Left to right*: Buck Juit, a soldier; Lamon; Ozias M. Hatch; Marcy; Reeves; General McClelland; President Lincoln; General Fitz-John Porter; General McClellan; Joseph Camp Griffith Kennedy; Garrett (in light hat); Mather.
