The people are beginning to settle down for one of the shortest—and greatest—inaugural addresses in history.

On Lincoln's left are the justices of the Supreme Court; on his right are the members of his cabinet. At his immediate right, seated with crossed legs, is Andrew Johnson; and, next to Johnson, looking towards the cameraman, is the outgoing Vice-President, Hannibal Hamlin. Lincoln is half-a-head taller than his running mates.
