H. F. WARREN of Waltham, Massachusetts, wanted desperately to take a picture of Lincoln. He was not acquainted with the President and had no connections in Washington. But he had a plan. Warren found out that Tad went riding on his pony every afternoon about three. He “ambushed and shot” young Lincoln astride his pony and on the following afternoon delivered the prints to Tad. The boy was delighted with them.

“Now,” said Warren, “bring out your father and I will make a picture of him for you.”

Tad dashed off, and in a few minutes appeared on the south balcony of the White House with the President.
