ONE OF THE MOST POPULAR of Lincoln photographs was the Brady portrait of Lincoln and Tad. Many variations were issued in the form of retouched photographs, paintings, lithographs, and woodcuts. Some were published as photographs. Three variations were numbered by Meserve as separate poses, two of which (M-40 and M-41) are illustrated on this page.
